Ethically Speaking: Straight from the Horse's Mouth

NOTE: No partial CEs will be awarded. You must attend the full training day.

Both the morning and afternoon presentations will first provide Academic/PowerPoint learning, then we will proceed into the arena in order to engage experientially with the material, via the APA and ACA recognized EAGALA model for Equine Assisted Learning activities with our equine team.

After lunch, the Part II/Afternoon training will address ethical considerations. The morning session content will build onto the afternoon session content, in which participants will step through an ethical dilemma decision-making process, which has multicultural considerations included as part of the dilemma.

Goal:

Enhance ethical practice and awareness using didactic (left brain) and experiential (right brain) approaches.

Objectives:

1. Discuss the foundational principles, values, and professional responsibilities that inform ethical practice.
2. Identify the values, ethical principles, and personal qualities relating most significantly in your own current practice.
3. Consider areas of strengths and explore next steps for continued growth in your own ethical practice, as a means of exploration and integration.
4. Demonstrate knowledge, exploration, and integration of the values for navigating ethical dilemmas, which can often overlap with cultural considerations, through equine assisted learning via the EAGALA model.
